

DIVINE HEALING

"Behold, I will bring it health and healing; I will heal them and reveal to them the abundance of peace and truth. Jer 33:6 (NKJ)

Healing in the Old Testament

But to you who fear My name the Sun of Righteousness shall arise with healing in His wings; and you shall go out and grow fat like stall-fed calves. Mal 4:2 (NKJ)

..and said, "If you diligently heed the voice of the LORD your God and do what is right in His sight, give ear to His commandments and keep all His statutes, I will put none of the diseases on you which I have brought on the Egyptians. For I am the LORD who heals you." Exod 15:26 (NKJ)

There is no set pattern for healing in the Old Testament.

So he went down and dipped seven times in the Jordan, according to the saying of the man of God; and his flesh was restored like the flesh of a little child, and he was clean. 2 Kings 5:14 NKJ)

Healing in the New Testament

"But that you may know that the Son of Man has power on earth to forgive sins"-- then He said to the paralytic, "Arise, take up your bed, and go to your house." Matt 9:6 (NKJ)

All healing had a purpose in the New Testament

When evening had come, they brought to Him many who were demon-possessed. And He cast out the spirits with a word, and healed all who were sick, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Isaiah the prophet, saying: "He Himself took our infirmities and bore our sicknesses." Matt 8:16-17 (NKJ)

Not everyone who needed healing was healed John 5:3-6.

Healing guidelines James 5:13-15

Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing psalms. Is anyone among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise him up. And if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven. James 5:13-15 (NKJ)

1. Confess your sins
2. Take a step of faith
3. Believe God is able to heal you
4. Ask elders to anoint you with oil and pray
5. Ask someone to lay on hands and pray in faith
